RECYCLING UPDATE:

Yesterday my car was loaded up with various items from the Op Shop to take to the Warrandyte Uniting Church recycling day (Sat 19th Nov). On arrival it was evident that the church recycling was too small an operation for our needs so it was suggested that I take my car load of stuff to the **Nullumbik Recycling Centre in Yan Yean Road, Plenty.** Luckily it is open all weekend **and FREE!**

The recycling centre is very organized with large skips for all manner of stuff – my main haul was batteries, light globes, DVDs, Cds, mobile phones, electronic waste and printer cartridges, most of which has been stock piled at the Op Shop, but some was from under our house. A nice man helped dispose of the heavy items. It was very cathartic!

I suggest if you check out the web site and when you are having a good clean out don't put it in the rubbish bin – take it to the recycling centre for disposal. The only item we have at home that we don't know what to do with is empty paint tins. If anyone can advise please let me know.

Steve Ennor and I will meet in a few weeks to develop a strategy around disposing of the Op Shop recycling that is not being catered for by Bunnings/Woolies/Officeworks so it does not stock pile too much. What a pity we cannot take our soft plastics to Coles any more. Lets hope they get on top of that in the not too distant future.

Items accepted for free

We accept the following items free of charge:

Item	More information
batteries	This includes household, car and mobile phone batteries.
cardboard	Loads are limited to a car boot size (no waxed cardboard).
CDs and DVDs	Cases included.
e-waste	This includes any item with a plug, cord or battery. For example: computers, appliances, tools, electronic toys, phones.
household recycling that can fit in a kerbside recycling bin	For example: hard plastic bottles/containers, paper, glass bottles/jars, tins and cans. Items that are too large for a kerbside recycling bin cannot be accepted.


