DISTRICT PRESIDENT'S MEETING REPORT FROM 22 APRIL:

Council on Legislation: all clubs will need to up - date their constitutions next year due to several will have enactments: more details when available.







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Melbourne International Convention: registrations will open on 4th June and for the first 4 days their will be a special registration rate of US\$425.

Regionalization Process: Zone 8 will be able to undergo regionalization – meaning we will have autonomy rather than being answerable to Rotary in Chicago. Good news – relevant people from District will be going to clubs soon to explain it – all clubs will need to vote on this matter before October this year.

The Rotary Foundation – Ukraine Fund – is now taking donations: the funds raised going to assist neighboring countries who are taking in the bulk of Ukrainian refugees. NOTE – ROTARY WILL NOT BE FUNDING THE WAR IN UKRAINE – rather – assisting refugees.

DID YOU KNOW? — when you make a personal donation to **The Rotary Foundation** for a fund such as the Ukraine Fund above it is counted in your **personal points toward a Paul Harris Fellow.** So, if you are a Centurion (\$100 per year per Rotarian) or a Paul Harris Society Member (\$1000 per year), it is possible for you to receive, out of the blue, a box with a PHF from Paramatta once you get to over \$1000. When the system of awarding PHFs was first devised it was **all about personal donations/giving to TRF.** Just an interesting fact for you to be aware of. If you have a PHF and you don't know where it came from it will probably be from personal donations!

Hybrid Meetings in a Box: the district IT team are thrilled that 30 clubs have availed themselves on the Hybrid Meetings in a Box – enabling them to have an in person meeting plus Zoom at the same time – great if members are unable to attend or to have a guest speaker from afar.

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
NEXT MEETING: The Grand Hotel Warrandyte
