WCC is a dynamic organization with values that align with the values of Rotary. During Royce's wonderful presentation he showed us slides of information about the fantastic work of the club in promoting leadership qualities in their young players. Royce said the quality the club values and fosters in its players is not their cricket prowess but their behaviour and attitude to each other and toward the community. An example of that is that they do not pay their players, where other clubs do. In spite of this they attract the right sort of players who are more interested in the holistic approach of the club.

They have great support from parents and the wider community – displayed so well recently when they held their Pink Stumps Day and raised a significant amount of money for the Breast Cancer support program.

Royce said that as our philosophies align so well he would love to see more partnerships between us and the cricket club – they use our annual funding to help fund the leadership program (CRISP) and can see ways the cricket club might be able to help us – with well over 300 members they have a wide skill set and wide range of ages. Royce's dream is to one day have teams of disabled players such as blind team.

We look forward to a special night to be held at the club rooms to see more of their work and Royce will also let us know when they hold their wine tasting – a blind wine tasting evening which is great fun as well as informative for those who love wine (and who doesn't?)

It was a really informative presentation and much appreciated to see how well our money is spent.
