



Guest Speaker: Jock MacNeish OAM, is an architect, illustrator and cartoonist with an interest in work systems. He studied at RMIT University from 1966 to 1970 graduating with a Bachelor of Architecture. Jock had attended the Keil School in Dumbarton , Scotland from 1955 to 1958. Jock worked as an architect before working as a staff cartoonist for The Age and Post Courier and as a set designer and producer for the ABC in Melbourne and Sydney. His reputation has been built on his ability to help

people to capture the essential elements of complex systems. He does this with systems illustrations, cartoons, character and caricature portraits and sometimes water colours. Jock is one of the founders of the Warrandyte Diary and is well renowned as a cartoonist in the Diary.

In 1970 local identity Cliff Green established the Warrandyte Diary, seeing a need for a publication that reflected the local community. The Diary was set up as a trust, partly to protect the integrity of the content so it could be insulated from influences such as by politicians or people with a cause. Steve Vizard came on board and developed the structure of the Warrandyte Arts and Education Trust which is now the overarching body. Jock is a board member along with Mary Ann Gibson, Caroline Shaw and David Tynan.

Some years ago, it was decided to establish the Warrandyte Youth Arts Awards to come under the banner of the WAET with the aim of promoting young artistic talent and giving young artists an avenue for mentoring and furthering their careers.

The aim of the Award is not to select the best young artist but the one who shows the greatest potential. The artists are asked to choose a person who could assess them, which gives them the ability to establish relationships with established artists who can offer support and encouragement. The assessors have all been very enthusiastic and offered to continue their involvement in the future if needed. The type of







artists who have been involved over the years range from ballet dancer, opera singer, embroider, sculptor – so the criteria of "artistic" talent is very broad.

The whole process takes 2 years to complete and has been extremely successful in helping young artists. WYAA are looking for further sponsorship such as Rotary may be able to offer.

Special Guest Speaker: Andrew Yen

Teacher/Astronomer/Engineer.

Andrew has a life long passion for astronomy and now puts his knowledge to use by teaching full time. We are lucky to have Andrew come to present to us, so take advantage of this opportunity and join us for the evening.

Using the latest technologies to teach—with robotic telescopes that students can operate from the classroom, Andrew's students have been getting some outstanding results, both astronomically and in learning. Some of them have developed new astronomical techniques, discovered variable stars and distant planets.

Andrew will be going to South Africa in August 2024 to address the International Astronomical Union, the peak professional body for Astronomers. Over 3000 professionals will debate planets, stars and galaxies, the biggest ground based and space based telescopes and the future of astronomy. They are also interested in how Andrew teaches astronomy to the next generation of astronomers.

Astronomy was the original science, astrologers foretold futures and cultures told stories in the sky's patterns — today astronomy is increasingly relevant to humanity's future.
